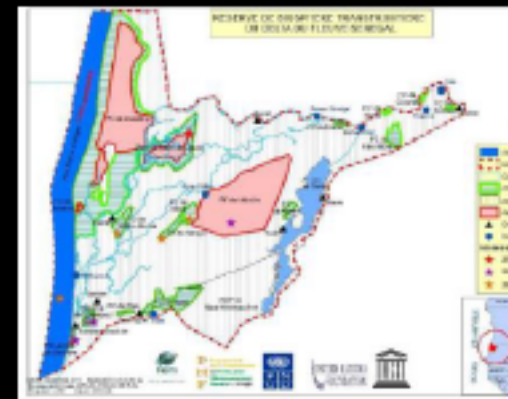
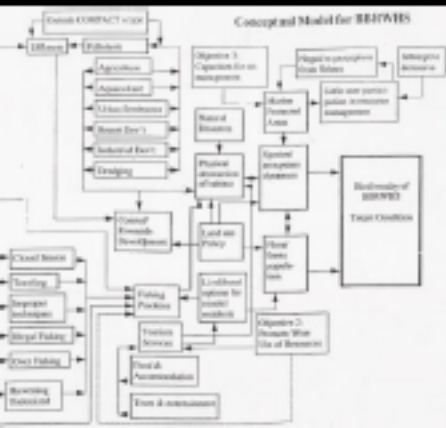

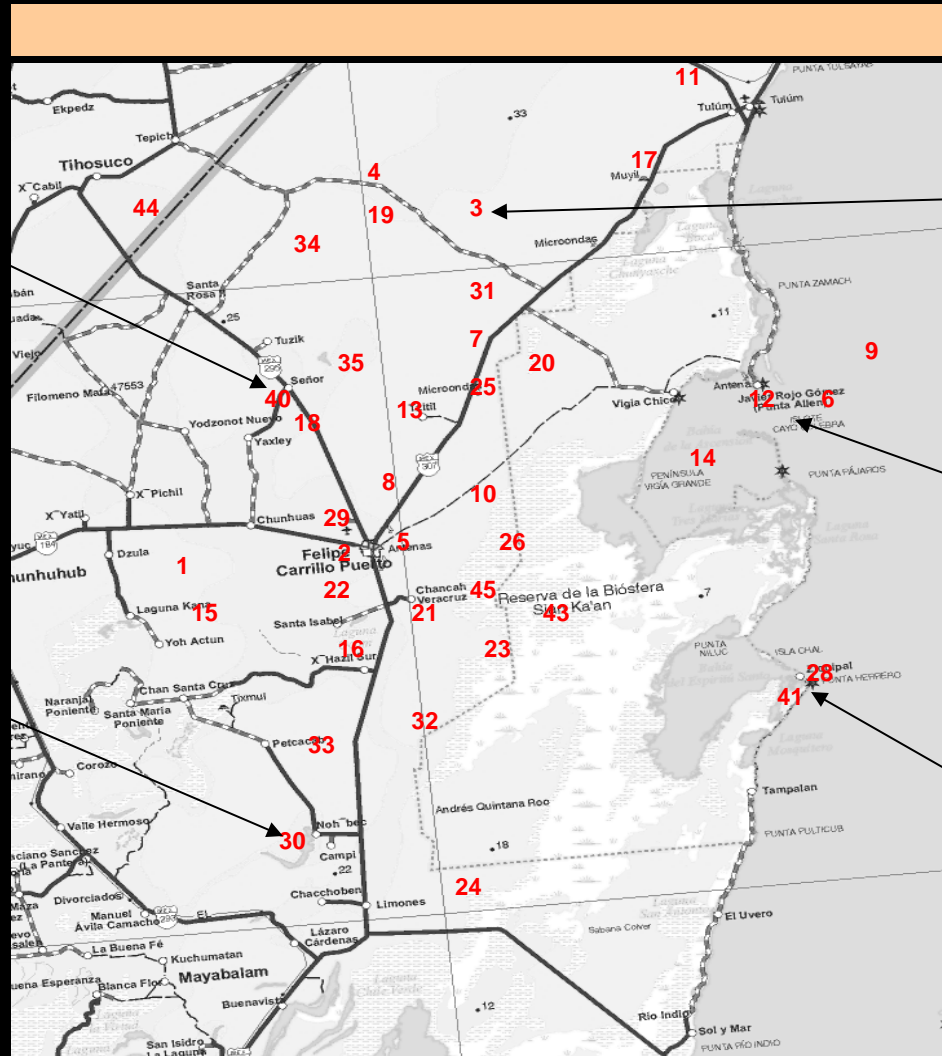

whole = greater than sum of parts

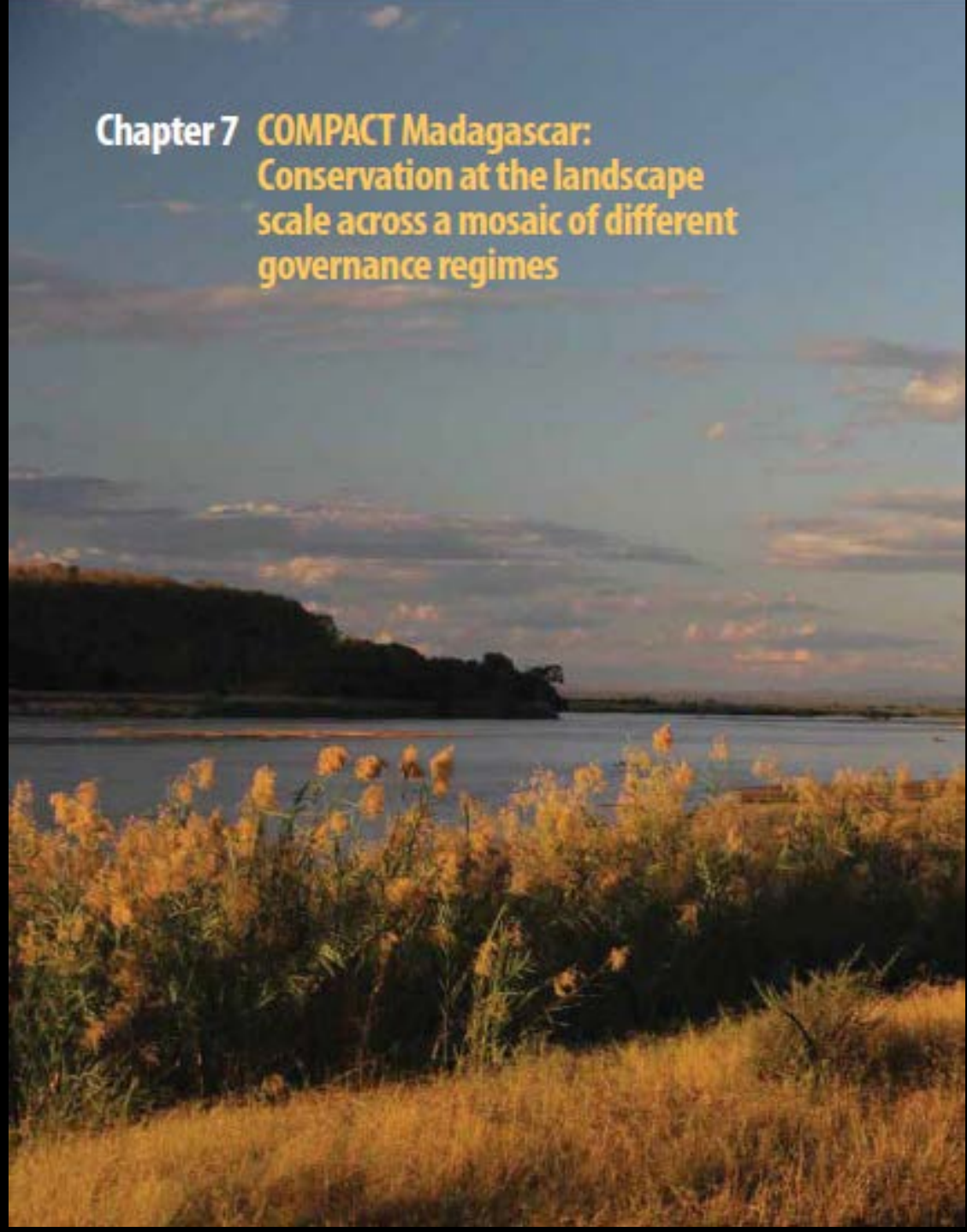




Learning by Doing
